We know there were many, in-person events scheduled all over our valley for Earth Day, but were canceled due to Covid-19 and the need to practice social distancing. So, still wanting to bring people and students together to think about our Earth and Earth Day, on Earth Day's 50th anniversary, we bring to you the Earth Day Art Project!

Teacher Instructions:

- 1.) Print the following documents for each student:

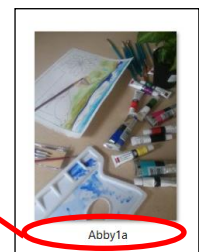
- 2.) Assign each student a project number and write it on their submission form.
 - a. Number each student 1 through the highest number in your class or classes (if you have multiple classes of the same or different grades).
 - i. Ex: Class One: Jane #1, Jimmy #2, ... Tommy #25
 - ii. Ex. Class Two: Josh #26, Emily #27, etc.

 - b. This will be VERY important when students are submitting their projects.

 - c. Along with their name, they MUST attach this student project number to the photo of their Earth Day Art Project.

- 3.) Give the printed student directions and submission forms to your students.

4.) Students use the provided Project Prompt and Project Description to complete their art project.

- a. They can recruit other family members to help them with their project if they need or want to.

Project Prompt *What actions can you take to make your everyday life more Earth-friendly?*

Project Description Visually represent an everyday action that you can take, or adapt, around your home, community, or the Flathead Watershed to make the Earth healthier!

Project Examples

- a photo of you using cloth rags instead of paper products to clean surfaces at home
- a picture chart of things you can recycle at home
- a painting of a native species to Montana that you want to protect (Ex. Westslope Cutthroat Trout)
- creating a map of all the recycle centers in town
- a poem about your favorite outdoor place in the Flathead Watershed and the ways we can protect it
- a model of a local town with a new design to make it more eco-friendly (Ex. Bike Paths)
- ... or ANYTHING YOU CAN THINK OF!

5.) If students need more inspiration to create their Earth Day Art Project, they can use the Earthday.org's Daily Earth Day Challenges (plus a few ideas of our own) that are listed on the back of their project directions.

6.) When finished, the students must return the following items to you:

 - iii. A brief project description at least 1-2 sentences long
- b. A PHOTO OF THEIR EARTH DAY ART PROJECT with
 - i. Their name and Student Project #

7.) Turning in your class' Earth Day Art Projects

- a. When you've received all of your class' submission forms and project photos please put them in a Google Folder.
- b. THE MOST IMPORTANT STEP...Please make sure the file names of the submission forms and project photos are LABELED WITH THE MATCHING STUDENT FIRST NAMES AND PROJECT #s!

- a. There is a space on the Submission Form to add your own due date if you would like the students to return it to you before May 6th.
